

# Foreign qualification assessment

The extract indicates what a foreign qualification is comparable to in the Swedish qualification system. The information can be used when applying for a job or planning for further studies. Decisions regarding employment, admission or formal professional recognition are made by the employer, education provider or competent authority.

## About the qualification comparison

UHR's assessment reflects the number of years to which the foreign qualification is comparable at a particular level of higher education in Sweden, since the foreign qualification has no direct comparison among Swedish degrees.

The foreign qualification is in a profession that is regulated (requires authorisation) in Sweden. The Swedish National Agency for Education is the competent authority that decides on certification for teachers and preschool teachers. Please visit [skolverket.se](http://skolverket.se)

The first cycle represents the first level in a three-part European structure for higher education (Bologna level 1). The figure below shows qualifications at this level.

This assessment is provided as guidance by UHR. It is based on our knowledge of the country's education system and not on the individual's education documents. UHR applies the principles of the international recognition convention Lisbon Recognition Convention and assumes the foreign qualification is recognised in the country of study.

## Facts about Degree of Bachelor of Education (1 year)

<b>Duration</b>	1 year
<b>Information about the qualification</b>	The qualification, which is based on previously completed basic education, prepares for professional activity as a teacher in Canada. The qualification gives access to Master's level programmes in Canada.
<b>Recognised higher education institutions</b>	<a href="#">Canadian Information Centre for International Credentials (CICIC)</a>  Please note the country can have additional recognised education institutions.
<b>Country information</b>	Canada has 13 education systems, 10 provinces and 3 territories. The ten provinces are Alberta, British Columbia, Manitoba, New Brunswick, Newfoundland and Labrador, Nova Scotia, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, Québec and Saskatchewan. The three territories are the Northwest Territories, Nunavut and Yukon.

## The level of Swedish qualifications and degrees

Swedish degrees and final grades are placed within reference frameworks that show different levels of learning outcomes. In the figure, the Swedish reference framework SeQF is shown as well as the European reference frameworks that facilitate comparison to other countries. Please note the figure does not contain all Swedish qualifications.
