The extract indicates what a foreign qualification is comparable to in the Swedish qualification system. The information can be used when applying for a job or planning for further studies. Decisions regarding employment, admission or formal professional recognition are made by the employer, education provider or competent authority.

## About the qualification comparison

UHR has assessed the foreign qualification in comparison to a Swedish level of higher education. A more precise comparison to one year of studies at the Bachelor's level or a Higher Education Diploma depends on factors such as the qualification's nominal length of study and can only be provided on the basis of individual documentation.

The first cycle represents the first level in a three-part European structure for higher education (Bologna level 1). The figure below shows qualifications at this level.

This assessment is provided as guidance by UHR. It is based on our knowledge of the country's education system and not on the individual's education documents. UHR applies the principles of the international recognition convention Lisbon Recognition Convention and assumes the foreign qualification is recognised in the country of study.

<b>Duration</b>	2 - 3 years
<b>Credits</b>	Ca 70 - 115 credit hours (cr.hr.). The credits system may vary between the country's higher education institutions.
<b>Information about the qualification</b>	<p>The qualification was phased out from 2003.</p> <p>There are both academic and vocational qualifications. The qualification may give access to and also be credited into a Bachelor's level programme in Ethiopia.</p>
<b>Recognised higher education institutions</b>	<p><a href="#">Recognized public higher education institutions (Internet archive - Wayback machine)</a></p> <p>Please note the country can have additional recognised education institutions.</p>
